VOTING IN NYC FOR SURVIVORS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE





if you are a *U.S. citizen*, you have the right to register to vote and participate in elections

Concerned about keeping your voter registration information confidential?

Here's how you can safely exercise your right to vote.

Step 1

Go to a Supreme or Family Court in your borough (see back cover of this booklet for details) for a court order that will require the NYC Board of Elections to keep your voter registration record separate from other records. If you need assistance requesting the court order, go to the court's help center (see www.nycourts.gov/courthelp/goingtocourt/helpcenters.shtml for more info).

Step 2

Take a copy of the court order to your local Board of Elections office (see "BOE Offices and Courts in New York City" section) to register to vote. If you're already registered to vote, present the order to election officials to make sure your personal information, such as your home address, is kept separate and confidential.

Step 3

On Election Day, you can go to your polling place to vote as usual, but if you are concerned about voting in person, you can contact your local BOE office and request a "Special Absentee Ballot," which will allow you to vote without having to go to a public polling place.
